Harmony in Religion

Laqad kar-ram naa banee Aadam
"Surely We have honoured the children of Aadam"
(The Holy Qur'an chapter 17 verse 70.)

Science has given the human being knowledge and has enhanced his greatest resource, the human mind. But science has insulted human dignity by declaring mankind's evolution from the ape while denying his creation from God

As we live in a world of rampant crime, blatant disregard for a fellow human's life, a break up of home and family life, increasing incidents of incest, rape and murder we seek solutions to the problems we face. The solution to the crime rate seems to be a larger police force and more prisons. As criminals become more sophisticated, crime prevention officers, too become more sophisticated in the use of weaponry, and the cycle continues. The physical body of one person is ever ready to fight against the physical body of another person. But the mind of one individual is afraid to combat the mind of another individual except during proselytising or conversion from one religion to another.

Morality and righteousness which influence the mind of the human being are scorned at and ridiculed.

Man, the weak creature that he is, keeps himself upright through power – religious, political, economic or physical; and not through principles i.e. religious or moral principles. Yet it is the strength within the human self that is more powerful than arms and ammunition. The world community knows that it is in this strength within the human soul or spirit that the solution to every conflict between humans lies.

The struggle for human dignity lies in evolving the dignity of the individual self. A dignity that could only be obtained through the recognition of the Oneness of God and the brotherhood of man. Thus it is that the Holy Qur'an 2:62 affirms: "Surely those who believe, and those who are Jews, and the Christians, and the Hindus, whoever believes in Allah and the Last Day and does good they shall have their reward with their Lord and there is no fear for them nor shall they grieve."

It is time that we give some more serious thought to the teachings of Islam which are in fact a method and a process for the development of the mind, for the development of integrity, for the enhancement of the soul! Islam must not be typified as a religion of fundamentalists, nor is fundamentalism to be equated with militancy or extremism. The Islamic faith rather is based upon fundamental human values and concepts of God.

It is the Holy Qur'an which teaches in 2:213 the fundamental concept that: "Mankind is a single nation" and in 49:13 "God has created you as tribes and families that you may know each other." The solution to the problems of humanity lies in fostering inter-religious harmony. To achieve this, powerful leadership is required. The Holy Prophet Muhammad didn't need an election to become a leader first to the Arabs then to the world.

We must highlight the Qur'anic concept of **Jihaad** as striving with the Qur'an for this is the foundation for religious concord based on the principle that religion must be propagated not with the SWORD of God but with the WORD of God.



The Purpose of the Mosque is to Foster Religious Harmony

"(All) The mosques are Allah's. So call not upon anyone with Allah." (72:18)

"Only he can maintain the mosques of Allah who believes in Allah and the Last Day, and keeps up prayer and pays the poor rate and fears none but Allah." (9:18)

"And who is more unjust than he who prevents (men) from the mosques of Allah, from His name being remembered therein..." (2:114)

"If Allah did not repel some people by others, cloisters and churches and synagogues and mosques in which Allah's name is much remembered would have been pulled down." (22:40)

"Certainly a mosque founded on observance of duty (taqwaa – self-restraint) from the first day is more deserving that you should stand in it." (9:108)

- 1) The Mosques belong to Allah, not to any individual or organisation or religion.
- 2) There are those who are the guardians of the Mosque and maintain it.
- 3) None can be prevented from the Mosque of Allah who wishes to remember or glorify Him.
- 4) Other places of worship must enjoy the same protection as the Mosque
- 5) The foundation of the Mosque is taqwaa self-restraint.

When Allah has given the sun, moon rain, air and the entire world to all – Hindus, Jews, Christians, Muslims etc. how could we think that religion especially the religion of Islam and the mosque is only for Muslims.

The Prophet Muhammad prayed in the Ka'ba even when there were idols in it.

Never be afraid to enter any place of worship to remember God. Never hesitate to invite people of any other faith to worship God in the Mosque. The Holy Prophet Muhammad allowed the Christians of Najraan to set up their crosses and worship in the Mosque.

Islam is an interfaith religion:

It recognises all religions are from God. All religions belong to Allah 2:193

It requires us to believe in all scriptures and all prophets. 2:4.

It acknowledges salvation to people of all religions. 2:62

It permits inter-dining and inter-faith marriages. (5:5)

It allows inter-religious worship of One God. (3:63)

If religion cannot bring us closer to each other how can it bring us closer to God?

Keys for a Succesful Marriage

That a marriage will last forever must not be a mere hope but a philosophy - work at it to make it work.

Separation must not be taken seriously as an option or as an easy choice.

Marriage has its weaknesses, its pains and hardships, its rages and despair. But when it is successful, it has moments of adventure and passion, of contentment and satisfaction, of companionship and deep love.

To enhance a loving relationship each partner must make and act upon these methods of good communication:

"Tell me often that you love me, through both actions and words. Don't assume that I know it. I may look embarrassed and even deny that I need the attention – don't believe me! Do it anyway. Praise me for jobs well done and reassure me when I fail. Don't take for granted the things that

I do for you.

Let me know when you feel low or lonely or misunderstood, it makes me stronger to know I have the power to comfort you. Even though I love you I cannot read your mind.

Express joyous thoughts and feelings. They bring liveliness to our relationship.

Let others know you value and cherish me. It makes me feel special and proud."

Getting married is good, staying married is perfection. But there is the need to distinguish between

marriage and mirage (reality) (dream)

In marriage affection must be developed through trust rather than through demands

Love may increase and decrease but trust in marriage is constant. Trust means exclusiveness and is a means to make one's spouse feel special. Trust is impossible without truth. Where there is no trust, there is no love.

Two ways of gaining affection

- Present oneself as frail and helpless and demand sympathy. This is the negative approach.
- 2. Present oneself as strong and supportive and encourage admiration. This is the positive approach.

People change - enjoy the past but live for the future. Between spouses many issues are neither right nor wrong but merely personal preferences. Feelings cannot be argued on; they must be either accepted or rejected. A mate is allowed angry feelings, differing opinions, other friends or occasional thoughtlessness.

Three elements of a successful marriage:

1. Companionship - Companionship means "being there" i.e. not putting one's interest e.g. TV, sports etc. before one's commitment to one's mate. Don't be casual roommates.

- 2. Communication Speak straight words says the Qur'an (33:70) i.e. be direct about your feelings and desires. Don't expect you spouse to be mind reader. Saying "I have a headache" must not be seen as complaining but rather as explaining one's feelings requiring an assurance of understanding.
- 3. Commitment Marriage is duty. It is a duty to God says the Qur'an (3:101;4:1).

Spouses must enrich each other's lives and not feel threatened by each other's differences or accomplishments rather they must relish them.

Enjoyment of each other is more than physical or sharing interests, it is sharing values especially religious values which are the strongest bond in our lives.

The greatest value is character and character is developed through religion.

The prophet Muhammad has truly said:

tunkahul mar atu li 'arba in, li maalihaa, wa li hasabihaa wa jamalihaa wa li deenihaa faz far bi dhaa tid-deen.

A woman is married for four reasons:

For her wealth, for her family background and her beauty and for her religious character.

Be conquered by her religious character

Your children are not your children.
They are the sons and daughters of Life's longing for itself.
They come through you but not from you,
And though they are with you yet they belong not to you.

You may give them your love but not your thoughts, For they have their own thoughts.
You may house their bodies but not their souls, For their souls dwell in the house of tomorrow, which you cannot visit, not even in you dreams.
You may strive to be like them, but seek not to make them like you.

For life goes not backward nor tarries with yesterday.

You are the bows from which your children as living arrows are sent forth.
